Owners—Chiller Replacement Project 2018

Another Infrastructure Update! In 2016 the heating system, hot water boilers and all nine pumps in the central utility building were replaced. Our cost was \$550,000 which was financed with dedicated operating funds and a loan against our Reserve CDs.

Currently the **chillers** need to be replaced. They were installed in 1995, are two years past their expected 20-year life span, and required numerous expensive repairs in 2016 and 2017. In addition, the **controller** which was installed in 1995 needs to be replaced. There are two other components of our central equipment: the **motor control center** and **switch gear** which are the electrical portions of the systems. The **switch gear is 50 years** old and was produced by Federal Pacific, a manufacturer which has been out of business for several decades, which means the replacement parts are extremely scarce and failure would render all systems inoperable therefore, it will also be replaced. Finally, the **motor control center** (where the breakers are located), needs to be relocated to allow space for the new chillers.

Four different vendors have submitted proposals. The total scope of the project will be about \$600,000. We are working with our banks and outside lenders to secure financing that would allow the Chiller Replacement Project to be completed in early 2018.



Opening your door to the unknown person on your doorstep today can change your life forever! (This article is written by a Crime Watch member whose family suffered a home invasion by a serial murderer and armed robber. The family survived to see the criminal executed in 1993.)

During the last couple of months, we have had reports in our various areas of suspicious people going door to door. The majority of our folks didn't answer the door--their brain cells were on high alert! Please do not open your door to a knock or your doorbell unless you are expecting a service man, our office/maintenance people, or a friend. The FBI reports men are worst offenders of opening doors to strangers. "Gun in face wins over man every time."

Rules — Gentle Reminders

Pets—Please maintain control of your pet at all time via LEASH! You are responsible for any HARM caused to other folks and/or condominium property. For pity sake please pick up your dog's POOP! Silently say -I am a responsible and kind dog owner...

Parking— All Residents: Please park in your designated numbered parking space or Condo Parking. Visitor parking is for visitors/service people. Please do not allow your vehicle bumper or front end extend over the sidewalks—Residents and service people need free access to sidewalks at all times. Silently say—I am a thoughtful resident and neighbor . . .

Garbage/Trash—Bag all trash and garbage. If any pizza box or to -go- box has had food in it, it is NOT recyclable unless you have scrubbed it very well.

Please place all food boxed cartons and containers in a kitchen trash bag and place in the trash containers. Any large Amazon or other cartons break down and place against the alley fence. Silently say—I help keep the racoons and possums and other critters away from the garbage and my neighbors patios.
